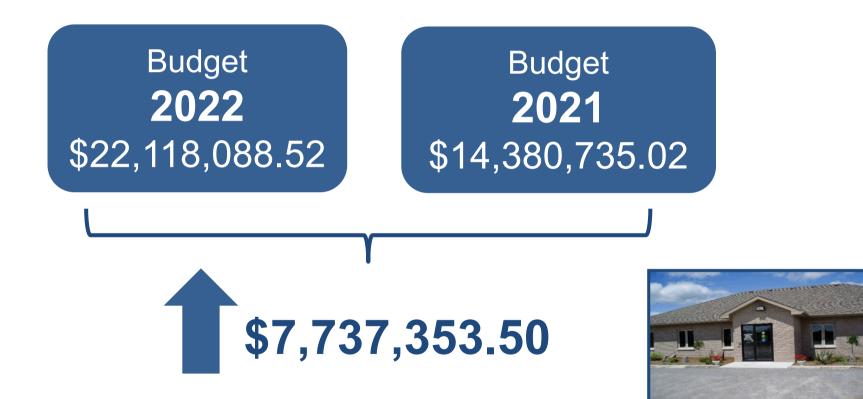

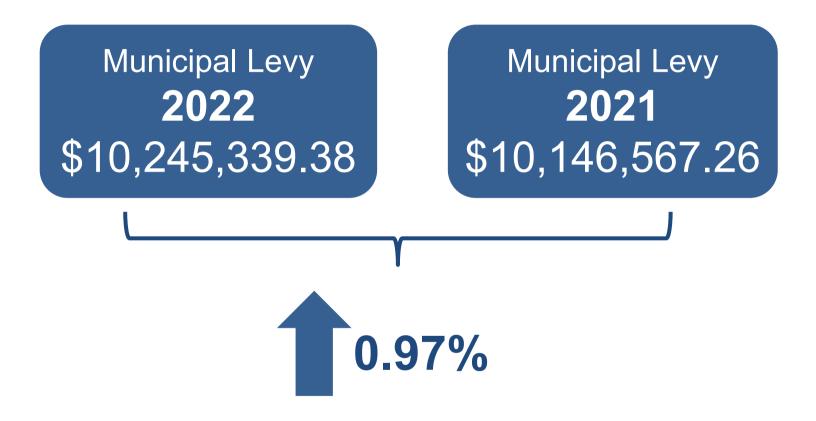

# Municipality of Trent Lakes

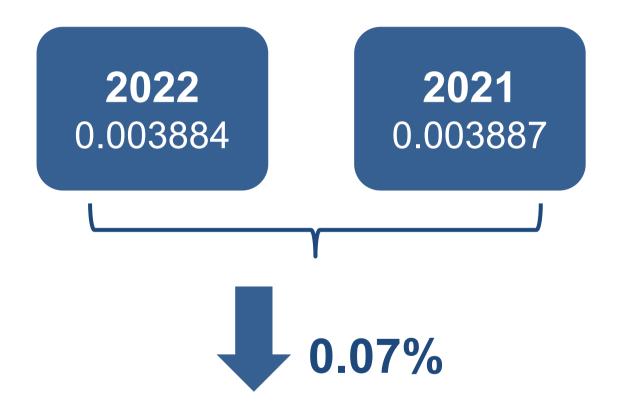


The balance of the budget is funded through grants, fees, borrowing and reserves

### 2022 COVID-19 Pressures

### **Potential Impacts**

- Uncertain financial impacts and future grant assistance
- Increased number of people staying all year resulting in more Fire Department calls and increased materials brought to Transfer Stations
- Increased Volunteer Fire recruitment, expenses and costing with a need to adapt training methods
- Purchasing delivery delays and lack of bidders on projects
- Increased costs for PPE, cleaning and equipment
- Continued changes in office processes to adapt to COVID restrictions

# Cost Savings Included



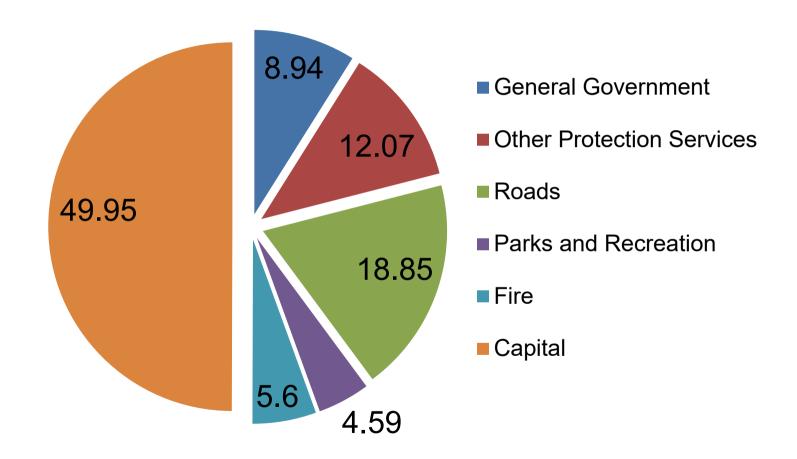
- Continued digitization and process efficiencies
- Purchasing efficiencies for Fire respirator program
- Joint tendering with the County for surface treatment and calcium chloride. Joint County training opportunities
- Internet and telephone voting for the election
- Operating efficiencies for road engineering. Also efficiencies for brush/yard waste grinding and compartment clean up costs
- Savings for digital attendance at conferences and courses

### Decreased O.P.P. Costs

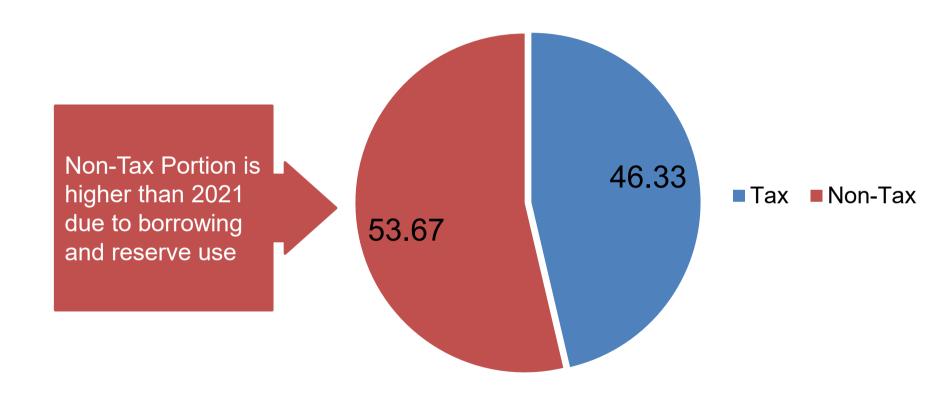


- Costs down \$16,746.00 or 1.01% for a total estimated billing of \$1,624,740.00 or \$228.90 per household for 2022 (7098 households in total)
- Overall amount of \$1,642,167.00 with annual reconciliation adjustment to billing amount

### Tax Versus Non-Tax Revenue

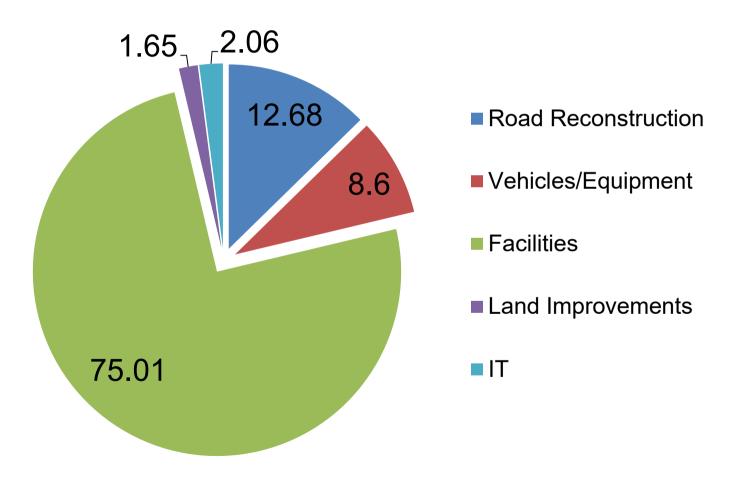
